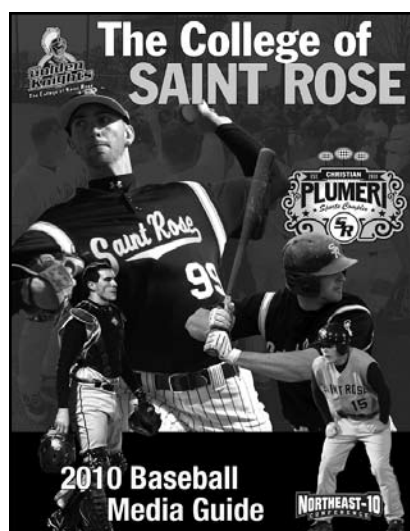

DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS AND RECREATION**Catherine Cummings Haker**

The architect of the athletics program at The College of Saint Rose, Catherine Cummings Haker brings with her a long and successful background in intercollegiate athletics and recreation administration.

Haker arrived at the College in 1976 as head coach of women's basketball, a position she held for 12 seasons while compiling a 186-124 (.600) record.

The College didn't even have a gymnasium upon her arrival as the Campus Activities

Center, home of the Golden Knights for 25 years, wasn't completed until 1978. The CAC has undergone numerous expansions throughout her tenure. It re-opened as the Events and Athletics Center following a \$7.5 million expansion and renovation project which was completed five years ago.

With Haker's outstanding leadership and guidance, the Saint Rose athletics program has flourished from one that consisted solely of men's and women's basketball teams to one that swelled to 17 programs. Today, the College boasts 17 intercollegiate programs that successfully compete at the Division II level of the NCAA. During her 33-year tenure, several of those teams have grown to national prominence and today the entire program is considered to be among the fastest growing in the East.

Haker has been instrumental in directing the expansion of the athletics program from membership in the small-college regional Northeastern Athletic Conference (NAC), to national affiliation with the NAIA and the Central Atlantic Collegiate Conference. She also directed the College's transition into the NCAA, ECAC and the New York Collegiate Athletic Conference and played a vital role in the College's successful bid for membership into the Northeast-10 Conference.

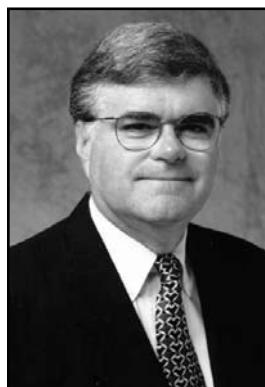
The qualities of a successful student-athlete are reflected in Haker's managerial style. The desires to improve and excel while focusing on team goals are illustrated by the department's growth throughout her tenure.

Haker served for six years as a basketball officials' supervisor for the ECAC and has served on numerous other committees for the NCAA, including serving as a member of the NCAA Division II women's basketball committee and as the chairperson of the NCAA Northeast Region women's basketball committee from 2000-2004. She has also been active in various committees for the ECAC, the East Coast Conference (formerly the NYCAC) and the NE-10 throughout her career.

Haker was President of the NAC for five years, was a member of the District 31 Executive Committee for the NAIA, held the positions of Secretary/Treasurer and Vice President of the CACC and served as Secretary and Vice President of the NYCAC. Furthermore, she has held both coaching and administrative positions for the Adirondack Region of the Empire State Games throughout a 17-year span.

Haker lettered in a number of sports at Bethlehem Central High School in Delmar, NY. Later, she was a three-sport standout at Hartwick College where she participated in field hockey, basketball and lacrosse.

Haker resides in Selkirk and has two children, Matthew and Corinn.

PRESIDENT, THE COLLEGE OF SAINT ROSE**Dr. R. Mark Sullivan**

As president since 1996, R. Mark Sullivan has led The College of Saint Rose during a period of unprecedented growth. Enrollment has increased by 25 percent, with 5,000 students participating in 66 degree programs, and 45 new faculty have been recruited. Under Sullivan's leadership, the College is recognized by U.S. News and World Report as one of the top 60 master's-level colleges in the Northeast-Middle Atlantic region. The College's highly successful capital campaign, Advancing the

Saint Rose Difference, raised just under \$26 million for the institution.

Prior to his appointment at Saint Rose, Dr. Sullivan served as executive vice president and chief operating officer of Marist College from 1987 – 1996 where he was instrumental in helping Marist attract nearly \$40 million in funding and led an effort to invest more than \$50 million to create new buildings. Before joining Marist, Dr. Sullivan was vice president for administration at Southern Connecticut State University. From 1978 – 1986, he served as assistant commissioner for the Connecticut Board of Governors for Higher Education and during his tenure helped create the Governor's Commission on Higher Education and the Economy, which led to major improvements in Connecticut's higher education system.

Dr. Sullivan taught public policy at Marist College, Southern Connecticut State University, and the University of Connecticut. He has written numerous articles and lectured widely on the role of technology in the liberal arts college environment, strategic planning in higher education, and urban policy.

Throughout his tenure at Saint Rose, Dr. Sullivan has advocated and supported numerous partnerships and alliances with Albany and Capital Region organizations and institutions. A \$50 million investment in new construction and technology upgrades has dramatically improved both the campus and the surrounding Pine Hills neighborhood. A strong advocate of community service, Dr. Sullivan is an active volunteer in the community and serves on several boards of directors.

Dr. Sullivan earned his Doctorate in Education at Harvard University with a research focus on the assessment of program quality at the post-secondary level. He earned his Master's in Public Administration at Syracuse University's Maxwell School of Citizenship and Public Affairs, and his Bachelor of Arts degree at the University of Rhode Island where he was President of the Class of 1970.

Dr. Sullivan has been honored by a number of organizations, including the University at Albany Foundation (Citizen Laureate), Maria College (Catherine McAuley award), and Progress High School in Brooklyn (State Educator of the Year).

COACHING STAFF

**Casey O'Connor - Head Coach**

Casey O'Connor, who served as an assistant to Bob Bellizzi for seven years, was named Bellizzi's successor on June 1, 2006 after coach Bellizzi passed away following a 28-year career at the helm of the Golden Knights.

O'Connor is thus only the second head coach for an entity that has traditionally been among the nation's top NCAA II programs. Saint Rose has made four NCAA Tournament appearances (1994, 1995, 1997, and 2000), made a run to the 2000 NCAA II World Series, won three NAIA Area 8 Championships and advanced to the 1990 NAIA World Series. The Golden Knights have had only six losing campaigns throughout 24 seasons of varsity competition.

Now in his fourth year, O'Connor steadfastly worked his way through the coaching ranks of the Saint Rose program. He

served as an assistant coach for the varsity team throughout the previous three seasons prior to his ascension to the head coaching position. O'Connor also spent three years as the head coach of the College's junior varsity program after working as an assistant with the JV club during the spring of 2000.

Furthermore, O'Connor served as head coach of the Albany Senators of the Albany Twilight League from 2003-2006 and had a head coaching stint with the North Colonie Padres Connie Mack team in 2000.

A former catcher and first baseman for the Golden Knights, O'Connor batted better than .300 in each of his last two seasons at Saint Rose. He hit .331 with 29 RBI and 25 runs scored as a senior in 1999 after batting .305 with eight home runs and 28 RBI throughout his junior campaign in 1998.

**Tim Christman - Assistant Coach**

Tim Christman is in his second year as an assistant to head coach Casey O'Connor. A veteran of 10 professional seasons including a stretch with the Colorado Rockies, the Oneonta, NY native serves as the program's pitching coach.

Christman, who spent the 2007 and 2008 seasons as an assistant at the University at Albany, was an 11th round draft pick of Colorado following a stellar career at nearby Siena College. He set a single-season school record with a mere 4.50 hits allowed per-nine innings and tossed the school's first no hitter in 1996. He also stands third all-time in Siena annals with 174 career strikeouts.

Christman spent his first two professional seasons playing "A" ball before sitting out the 1998 season due to an injury. In 1999, he held opposing hitters to a .222 batting average and posted a 2.42 ERA throughout 38 appearances

for class "A" Salem of the Carolina League. He spent the 2000 season at "AA" Carolina and then reached the majors with Colorado a year later.

Christman made 22 appearances in 2002 for the Florida Marlins organization while being hampered by shoulder problems. He then played for the independent St. Paul Saints in 2003 and part of the 2004 campaign, before his contract was purchased by the Seattle Mariners organization. The Mariners assigned him to "AAA" Tacoma where he went 2-0 on the strength of 45 strikeouts in 39.0 innings of work.

Christman returned to independent ball in 2005 and for the past few years has been a baseball instructor at Hayner Brothers Academy in Clifton Park, NY. Christman was inducted into the Siena Hall of Fame in 2004.

COACHING STAFF


**Jose Segura -
Assistant Coach**

Jose Segura returns to Saint Rose as an assistant coach for a fifth season. Segura, who closed out his three-year playing career at Saint Rose in 2003, handles the first base coaching duties and also works with the club's outfielders.

Segura was a preseason honorable mention All-America pick as a junior in 2002. That year, he went on to garner ABCA first-team All-Region and NE-10

first-team All-Conference accolades after he belted a school record (varsity era) six triples and finished second in the league with 18 stolen bases. He also batted .353, produced a 20-game hit streak and drove in a team leading 60 runs out of the leadoff position that year.

He wound up his career eighth all-time in school annals in hits (153), 11th in runs scored (113), third in triples (8) and tied for tenth in both home runs (22) and RBI (106).


**Eric Biehler -
Assistant Coach**

Eric Biehler is in his fourth season coaching with the Saint Rose baseball program. Biehler will be working primarily with the catchers this season and will assist with all hitters as well. He spent the 2007 season as the head coach for the College's junior varsity program. Biehler, an outfielder/catcher, was a .286 lifetime hitter as a Golden Knight. He belted four home runs, scored 21 runs and drove in 13 in his senior season in

2001. Biehler went to work as the hitting and outfield coach for Union College after graduating from Saint Rose with a degree in public communications in 2001. He spent three seasons with the Dutchmen before returning to his alma mater in the fall of 2006.


**Kevin Lishansky -
Assistant Coach**

Kevin Lishansky is in his second year as an assistant to head coach Casey O'Connor. Lishansky was a four-year member of the Saint Rose baseball program who spent his last two seasons as a catcher with the varsity squad. Lishansky hit .353 throughout 13 games with the junior varsity program as a sophomore after hitting .283 with 10 RBI in 15 games as a freshman in 2004.


**Jeremiah St. Louis -
Assistant Coach**

Jeremiah St. Louis is in his first year as an assistant to head coach Casey O'Connor. St. Louis closed out a stellar career in a Golden Knights uniform last spring when he earned All-Conference honors after going 5-3 with a team-best 2.15 ERA and 89 strikeouts throughout 71.0 innings of work.

His 3.43 career ERA represents the sixth lowest mark in the College's NCAA era (1991-92), while his 240 strikeouts are the fourth most in school annals. St. Louis furthermore set a school record with 1,289 batters faced, while his 285.2 innings pitched are the fourth most ever by a Saint Rose player.


**Matt Frey -
Assistant Coach**

Matt Frey is in his first year as an assistant to head coach Casey O'Connor. Frey spent the 2007 season in a Saint Rose uniform when he earned All-Conference honors after leading the team with a .318 batting average, 25 RBI, 56 hits and a .401 on-base percentage.

Frey was furthermore an All-American at nearby Schenectady County Community College in 2006 after he hit .482 with 38 runs scored and 37 RBI. He was subsequently named the SCCC Co-Athlete of the Year following his outstanding season.

Frey has spent the past three years as a hitting instructor at All Stars Academy in nearby Latham, NY, where he was recently promoted to the head hitting instructor position.

PREVIEWING THE GOLDEN KNIGHTS

Introduction: Fourth year head coach Casey O'Connor has methodically put the pieces in place throughout his tenure with the goal of constructing a balanced club that features a formidable lineup, a deep pitching staff, and enough overall team speed to afford The College of Saint Rose a chance to win regularly and capture a Northeast-10 Conference postseason berth. The 2010 version of the Golden Knights has enough of those attributes, along with an experienced nucleus, to meet its self-imposed expectations and justify the quiet confidence that resides within the program at this time in its storied history.

Eight starters, including three players who garnered postseason accolades from the NE-10 last spring, return to the batting order along with the majority of the pitching staff. There are also 15 newcomers comprised of 12 freshmen and three transfers.

In 2009, Saint Rose finished 21-27 overall and tied for seventh place in the 13-team, wood bat NE-10 with a 14-16 conference record. A 5-10 mark in one run games and a 4-4 record in two-run encounters ultimately kept the Golden Knights out of the sixth and final playoff spot. On a more positive note, the pitching staff lowered its ERA by more than a pair of runs to 4.08 as compared to 6.14 in 2008. The Golden Knights furthermore raised their batting average 35 points to .256, increased their on-base percentage 38 points to .341 and scored 259 runs, 88 more than it did two years ago. They wound up a modest ninth in the NE-10 in batting, but were sixth in on-base percentage and fourth in runs. The staff's ERA was the conference's sixth best mark as well. Naturally, all of those figures will have to continue on a similar path in order for Saint Rose to reach its goals this year.

Letterwinners Lost (13): Thirteen players are gone from a year ago. The most prominent of those includes three right-handers who accounted for 29 of the team's 48 starts. **Jeremiah St. Louis** (Tupper Lake, NY/Tupper Lake), who is now an assistant to O'Connor, earned All-Conference honors from the NE-10 for the second time in his career after going 5-3 with 89 strikeouts and a team-leading 2.15 ERA. He was fourth and sixth respectively among NE-10 hurlers in the latter two categories. **Nick DeMidio** (Scotia, NY/CBA) went a deceptive 2-4 with 53 strikeouts and a 3.91 ERA. He unfortunately received no more than three runs of support throughout three of his four losses. Finally, **Brendon Malkowski** (Guilderland, NY/Guilderland) finished 4-6 with a 2.73 ERA.

Letterwinners Returning – Pitchers (9 + 1 Red Shirt): This year's collection of talent may not be as dominant at the front end, but there is a plethora of depth and a lefty-righty balance that provide O'Connor with a litany of options. Five southpaws comprise a group of 17 pitchers who are expected to dress this season.

It will be a while before all the pieces fall into place, but at this time it appears that a pair of left-handers in junior **David Batchelder** (Troy, NY/Lansingburgh) and senior **Jake Kozar** (Norwalk, CT/Brien McMahon) will head up the starting staff. Senior right-hander **Paul Partridge** (Uniontown, PA/John Jay-NY), who did not throw off the mound

last season, is expected to anchor the back end of the bullpen although he will also be the starting first baseman and bat cleanup after belting a team-leading seven home runs in 2009.

Batchelder went 3-2 with a 4.41 ERA throughout 49.0 innings of work and eight starts. He held opposing hitters to a .243 batting average, the conference's 15th best mark, and fanned 42. He also allowed no more than one earned run during six of his 11 appearances. Kozar meanwhile wound up making only three starts due to injury and thus

finished with a 6.05 ERA during 19.1 innings of action. However, he is healthy and should carry a heavier workload this season.

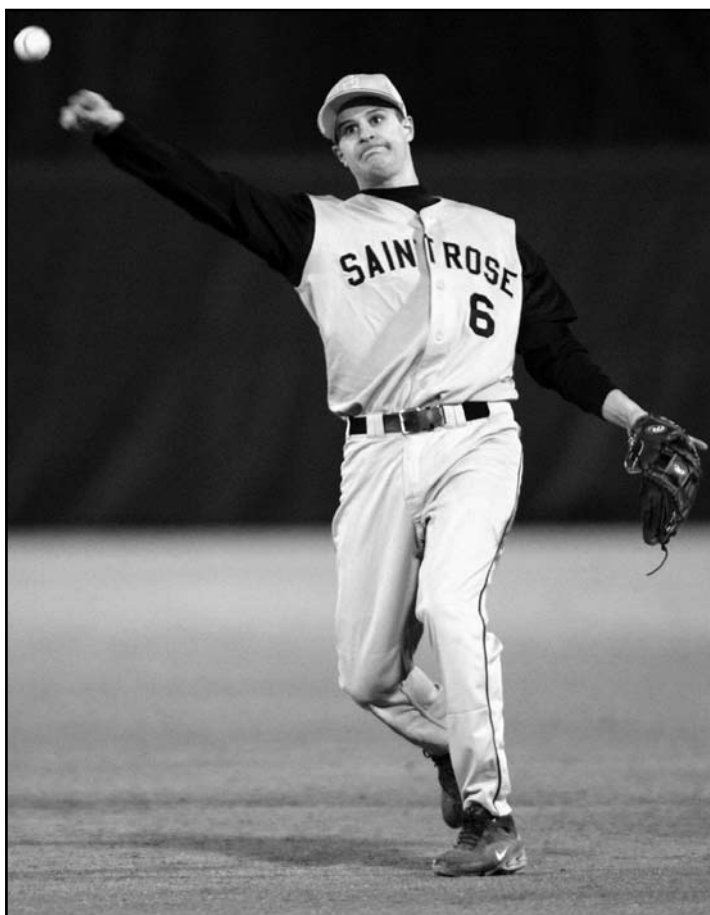
Also back in the mix are four right-handers in seniors **Nate Ward** (Milton, VT/Milton) and **Nick Downen** (Stony Point, NY/North Rockland), sophomore **Daniel Cavazzini** (Miller Place, NY/Miller Place), and junior **Doug Dulin** (Ossining, NY/Ossining), along with senior left-hander **Craig Borgen** (Athens, NY/Catskill). Sophomore right-hander **Tom McDonald** (Watervliet, NY/Shaker) is not expected to dress this season after making three appearances out of the bullpen a year ago.

Ward went 2-2 with a 2.59 ERA and a .222 batting average throughout two starts and nine relief appearances that encompassed 24.1 innings of work. Cavazzini did not figure in a decision although he recorded a 2.28 ERA over 23.2 innings, while Dulin posted a 3.68 ERA throughout 22.0 innings. Borgen finished 3-2 with a 4.11 ERA in 12 relief appearances, while Downen fanned nine throughout 12.0 innings of work.

Furthermore, junior right-hander **Nick Polsinelli** (Schenectady, NY/Guilderland) and sophomore right-hander **Richard Egloff** (Middle Island, NY/Longwood) are both pitching their way back from injuries and could provide the staff a boost as the season wears on. Polsinelli registered 17 strikeouts in just 18.0 innings of action a year ago after finishing second on the club with a 3.27 ERA as a freshman in 2008.

Newcomers – Pitchers (7 + 2 Red-Shirts): Heading the list of newcomers are a pair of transfers in senior southpaw **Donald Potter** (Oneonta, NY/Oneonta) and sophomore right-hander **Kevin Scrobola** (Cortlandt Manor, NY/Walter Panas). Potter spent 2009 at Mars Hill College (NC) where he made six appearances, while Scrobola went 1-0 with a 4.24 ERA throughout eight appearances at Caldwell (NJ).

They will be joined by seven freshmen including right-handers **Kyle LaValley** (Guilderland, NY/Guilderland), **Mark Ruggeri** (Newburgh, NY/Walkkill), **Jordan Zareski** (Speigletown, NY/Lansingburgh), and **Greg McCarty** (Delmar, NY/Bethlehem); along with left-hander **Eric Hilton** (East Greenbush, NY/Columbia). Two more freshmen southpaws in **Tom Buckley** (Elmont, NY/Kellenberg Memorial) and **Allen Lekocevic** (LaGrange, NY/Stissing Mountain) round out the list although they are expected to sit out this year.

Letterwinners Returning – Position Players (11): Four seniors, a pair of juniors and five sophomores are among the dozen veteran position players.

Heading the list is a pair of All-Conference picks from a year ago in senior outfielder **Ryan Price** (Binghamton, NY/Binghamton) and senior catcher/outfielder **Derek Marshall** (Malone, NY/Franklin Academy) along with sophomore second baseman **Michael Carbone** (Montreal, QUE/Vincent Massey Collegiate).

Carbone was named to the NE-10 All-Rookie squad after he finished 11th in the conference with a team-leading .331 (60-for-181) batting average. He also paced the Golden Knights with 25 RBI and 33 runs scored. Price wound up tied for seventh in the NE-10 with a team-high 18 stolen bases, in 22 attempts, and finished third on the squad with a .303 (50-for-165) batting average, right behind Marshall who hit at a .306 clip (48-for-157) with 24 RBI and 12 extra-base hits.

The remainder of the group is comprised of a pair of seniors in catcher **John Cole** (Spring Valley, NY/Spring Valley) and infielder **Zachary Halloran** (Albany, NY/Bishop Maginn) along with three juniors; infielders **Grant Smith** (Waterford, PA/Fort LeBoeuf) and **Ryan Burke** (Troy, NY/LaSalle), as well as outfielder **Garret Keenan** (Massapequa, NY/St. John the Baptist). Sophomore outfielder **Jesse Burba** (Port Chester, NY/Port Chester) is also back in the fold as is second-year infielder **Nick Alexandrovich** (Commack, NY/Commack) and sophomore catcher **Daniel Marshall** (Malone, NY/Franklin Academy).

Cole, who made 29 starts as a junior, is again expected to split the catching duties with Marshall, while Halloran won the starting shortstop job this past fall after missing virtually all of last year due to injury. Keenan is slotted for a starting corner outfield spot after batting .289 (39-for-135) last spring. Smith will be used at third and as the team's designated hitter. He started 35 games and batted .263 (35-for-133) in 2009.

Alexandrovich made 28 starts as a rookie and is expected to be used as a primary right-handed bat off the bench and as a reserve middle infielder. Burke started 27 games and should see time at third when Smith is slotted in the DH spot. Burba could potentially get regular playing time in the outfield after seeing action in 38 games, while Daniel Marshall will most likely have a backup catching role behind Cole and his older brother, Derek. Finally, sophomore outfielder **Andrew Simpson** (Guiderland, NY/Guiderland) is expected to sit out this season after appearing in 15 games.

Newcomers – Position Players (5): Junior outfielder **Tom Wiener** (Montrose, NY/Hendrick Hudson), a transfer out of SUNY Cobleskill who will also have a late inning relief role, and freshman outfielder **Scott Hladik** (Saratoga Springs, NY/Saratoga) head up this year's list of newcomers. Wiener hit .304 (24-for-79) with a team-leading 16 RBI and 46 total bases throughout 24 games for the Fighting Tigers last year where he also went 1-2 with a 3.81 ERA during a team-high 28.1 innings of work. Hladik, who will initially see some time as a DH, was named to The Saratogian All-Star team after he led the Blue Streaks with a .388 batting average, six home runs, and 22 RBI as a senior.

They are joined by two more freshmen outfielders in **Justin Lewis** (New Rochelle, NY/Iona Prep) and **Caleb Gleason** (Watervliet, NY/Watervliet) along with freshman catcher **AJ Capone** (Lowville, NY/Lowville). Freshman infielder **Carlos Fermin** (New York, NY/George Washington), who is being red-shirted this spring, rounds out the list of newcomers.

Schedule: Saint Rose opened 1-3 with a four-game series, February 12-14, at Newberry College in South Carolina. The Golden Knights will now embark on their annual spring trip through Florida. Saint Rose is scheduled to play 11 games during a 10 day stretch, before making its home debut on Saturday, March 20 when the Golden Knights will christen Bob Bellizzi Field at the Plumeri Sports Complex. It will also mark the NE-10 opener with Saint Anselm visiting for a twin-bill. Three-time defending NE-10 Champion Franklin Pierce arrives a week later for a doubleheader. The NE-10 Tournament is set

to get underway on Thursday, May 6. Overall, Saint Rose is scheduled to play 26 league games and another 26 non-conference contests.

Summation: This is a group that collectively endured some growing pains throughout the past three years. However, they have also had the opportunity to gain valuable experience that should serve them well in 2010. Overall, the club has more offensive firepower and overall team speed than perhaps any other that O'Connor has fielded. The pitching staff is also as deep as any that O'Connor has had at his disposal, although it may not possess the frontline starters that last year's club did.

The roster is comprised of 23 veterans, including 10 seniors, along with 15 newcomers. There is enough talent on board to warrant a top-six NE-10 finish and a subsequent postseason run, despite the Golden Knights being chosen in a tie for 10th in the preseason coaches' poll. One key will be the team's ability to manufacture some runs, especially with a home field that appears to be a pitching haven at this early juncture. Furthermore, someone on the staff will need to step forward and thus complement the likes of Kozar, Batchelder, Scrobola and Potter at the front end. However, those are relatively minor issues and thus come May the Golden Knights should be poised to leave their mark in the NE-10 Tournament.

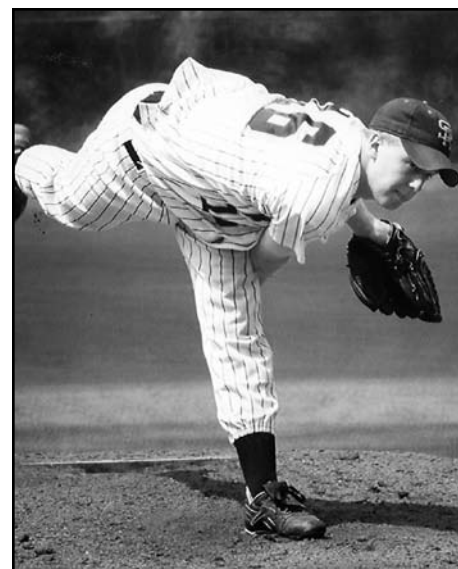
